TOUR 1: UNIVERSITY OF SYDNEY CHARLES PERKINS CENTRE - BIOLOGICAL SERVICES UNIT

The Charles Perkins Centre is a multidisciplinary initiative focused on reducing the burden of chronic disease through collaborative, systems-based research. Within the Centre, Laboratory Animal Services (LAS) supports high-quality animal research for both internal and external partners through a team of technicians, facility officers, and veterinarians. The tour will showcase state-of-the-art rodent and large animal facilities, along with advanced preclinical imaging and hybrid theatre environments.

The following prerequisites for entry and also a confidentiality agreement are required for this tour. The relevant forms will be emailed to you and collected on the day of the tour.

- Not having entered another animal facility 48hrs prior to your visit
- Not owning rodents as pets
- Q Fever declaration for the large animal facility and masks will be supplied.
- Confidentiality agreement.

TOUR 2: BEHIND-THE-SCENES TOUR OF THE AUSTRALIAN MUSEUM RESEARCH INSTITUTE

Australia's first museum, the Australian Museum, has a collection of more than 22 million specimens and objects and is home to the Australian Museum Research Institute (AMRI). AMRI specialises in taxonomy, genomics, ecology, and conservation projects that seek to better understand and protect Australia's extraordinary biodiversity.
